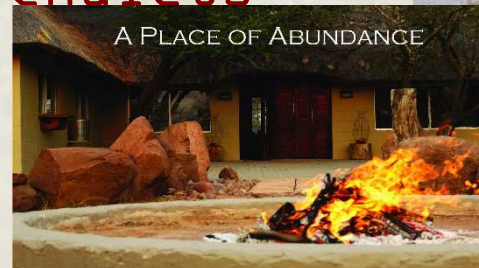

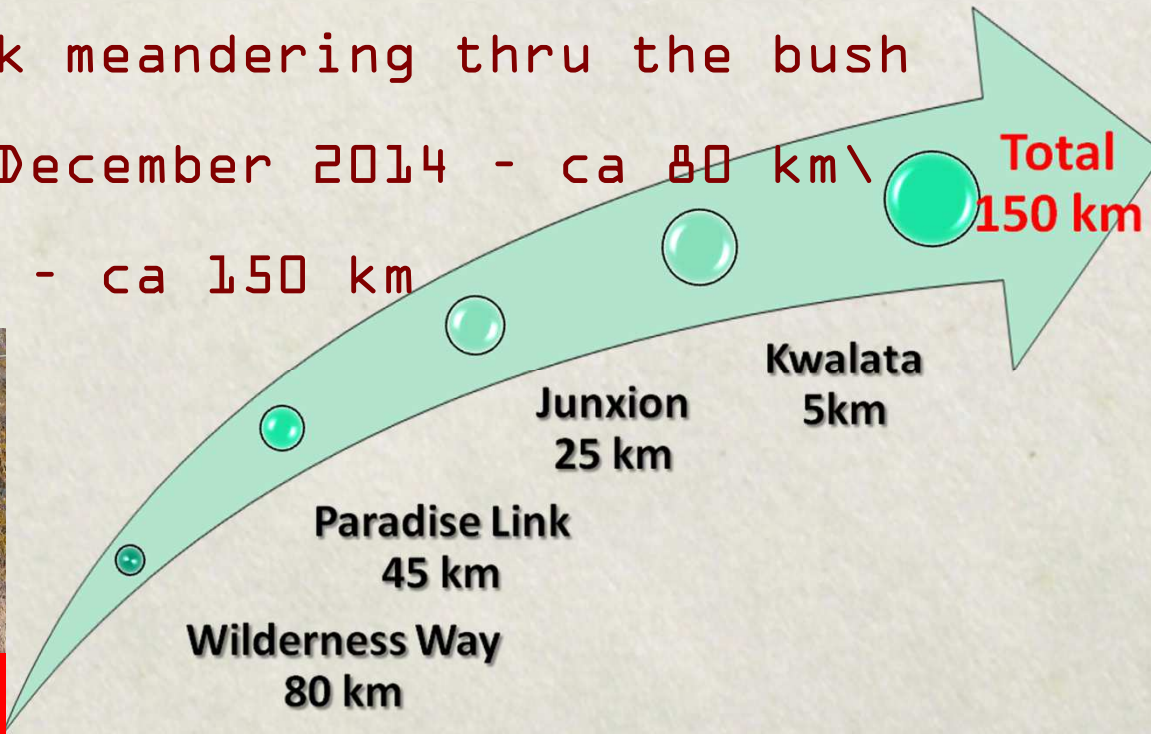
Self Drive Route

Respect their comfort zone when you approach any of our animals

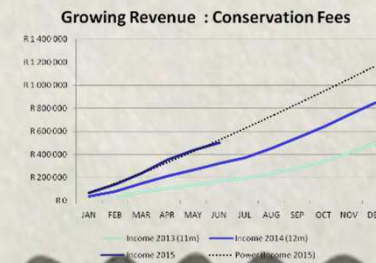


Past, Presence & Future
